



From I-5 take exit 194 at Everett, for Highway 2 eastbound to Monroe and Stevens Pass. Travel 5 miles on Hwy 2 to junction with Hwy 9- take this exit, and turn left (northbound) across Hwy 2 overpass, and then take first right turn (approx ½ mile) onto Bunk Foss Road. Follow this to stop sign, then turn left (as gravel road straight ahead is rough). Travel to next stop sign, turn left again. Approx 1 mile of straightaway, farms on left, railroad tracks and Pilchuck River on right. Take next right turn onto Dubuque Road. Gravel pit on left. Cross 1-lane wooden bridge, then take next left turn onto paved road (not dirt road at end of bridge). Several signs will say "Machias Ridge Estates"- this is 38th St. SE. We are 1 mile in, on left side- large black mailbox, with my name and number on it.

P.S. if coming from Eastside, you may want to come up Hwy 405, then Hwy 522, then take Hwy 9 turnoff (by Fitz) and come up Hwy 9, through Clearview and past Snohomish, then follow this map, rather than go I-5. It's shorter that way.

It's been a while since you've heard from me- I didn't get my Report or other contributions to our editor Dave Larson in time for the last issue of the LOTUS LINES, and so he (quite rightly) went ahead and got the issue out without me; so, since Dave did all the work on the last issue, we'll give him a respite and I'm putting out this issue on my own. I'm running a bit late as usual, so I would ask that you take special note that our upcoming event, the Third Annual Evergreen Lotus Picnic, is coming up soon, on Saturday the 16th- I know this is less than the two weeks notice we have endeavoured to give you on upcoming events, for which I apologize; we will be calling all our members sometime in the next week, both to issue a personal invitation to the Picnic, to to get some idea of how many will be coming. We are hoping to get our largest-ever turnout for an Evergreen Lotus club event, so please do try and make it if at all possible, for at least part of the day. We are especially asking and hoping to see some of our members, some of which have been with us since the very beginning of the group over two years ago, that we have yet to see at a club outing.

Our group has grown at a rate that I would not have dreamed possible, two years or even one year ago- we are now over 60 members strong, with a number of additional prospective members; I initially, in discussions with some of our founding members who were knowledgeable on the local Lotus population, anticipated that we would have 25 or 30 members fairly quickly, and then add another 15 or 20 by the second year and then stabilize at that number (around 50), with any new members being balanced out by others leaving the group through moves or car sales. While we have lost very few members, we continue to gain new ones, and our current members continue to add more cars to the roster. Yes, I have added another car to my own collection- Lezlee and I bought a '70 Plus 2S down in California in mid-June, and so have been able to participate in the last two club events (the Vashon Tour in June, and last month's Pacific Rim Meet and EXPO Lotus Day in Vancouver), in our own running Lotus, which certainly made these events much more enjoyable for us and has my enthusiasm level much higher to get a few more of my cars running.

Included in this issue, along with info on the upcoming Picnic is another update to our roster, including our latest additions since the two previous rosters in the Jan/Feb and Mar/Apr issues, along with a few early renewals that were missed before (sorry) and a few address changes As a reminder, we don't prorate dues— whenever you join during the year, the dues are \$10.00 for which you receive all the years issues of LOTUS LINES, so if any newer members are missing any issues from this year, to which you're entitled please let me know. For example, I know that two members missed the last issue, because two copies were returned to me by the post office as the address labels fell off. I will have extra copies of all back issues available at the next meeting here (the picnic) so if you're missing something you can pick it up then.

I would also like to mention that, as we exchange newsletter with several other groups (Lotus Ltd. and the Lotus Car Club of BC, and the MG, Austin Healey and Triumph clubs) we receive some very interesting publications as a result, with some good ideas on club events which we will be stealing for future use, good tech articles on typically British car problems not confined to Lotus, etc.— these issues are available for anyone in the group that would like to go through them, and

we will start bringing them along to meetings to give you another opportunity to see what we're getting. We also receive the newsletter of the Northwest Alfa Romeo Club, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank them for their gracious invitation to our group to allow us to participate in their track day at SIR on the Fourth of July. We didn't have many participants from our club, primarily I think because of the close proximity to the Pacific Rim Meet less than a week later, and the fear that something would break that couldn't be repaired in time; I don't know if the Alfa club is planning to make this an annual event, from their latest newsletter I get the impression that this may have been a one-time affair, but I hope that's not the case and we'll have other opportunities to get together with them, and some of the other marque clubs that took part, whether at a track day or some other event.

The next such event is the forthcoming All-British Field Meet, on Labor Day Weekend, this year's event taking place August 29-31. For the benefit of our new members who didn't hear all our hype about last year's event, and aren't familiar with the ABFM- this is an annual event, hosted by JOCO (the Jaguar Owners Club of Oregon)- the past four years this has taken place at Portland Int'l Raceway, which among other things allows them to have a slalom course set up on the track for those so inclined to test their cars. The event is open to all British cars, and each year one marque in featured as the honored marque, with special trophies and events. Last year Lotus was the honered marque, and with tremnedous participation by LOLO (the Lotus Owners League of Oregon), the Lotus Car Club of BC, and our own Evergreen Lotus, there were over 70 Lotus participating on one or both days, which all who were present will agree was a most impressive sight. As this is the 10th year for the ABFM, it's understandable that this year Jaguar will be honored; while there certainly won't be as many Lotus on display this year, it's a fun event to attend and already some of us are making plans to go. All those who went last year should by now have received entry forms for this year directly from the Meet organizers; we also received a packet of 25 additional entry forms for our group, so if anyone is interested in participating, please let me know and I'll get a copy to you.

One other item—we are starting a scrapbook, which will include pictures of all our cars, and shots taken at various club events. So, we need a photo from each of you, of your car(s) in whatever state they are in at the moment, and preferably at least one shot showing you with your car, so we can better identify who owns what (with so many new members, this will help us all get to know each other easier and faster). If your car is a backetcase, let's see a shot of it now, so when the restoration os done we have a basis to compare it by; if you've just finished aground—up, five—year restoration and won't admit, even to yourself how much it cost, at least share with us the pictures you took when you started, and when you had it in more pieces than you thought the car had in total (doesn't everyone take "before" and "after" pictures? — I've got lots of "before" pictures at least myself).

On a sad note- I received a call a few evenings ago from Dick Pirkl's wife, telling me that he has just passed away. Dick was a new member-Mike Price foundhim stranded on the side of the road in his Elan, and helped him get the car running enough to get it home. Dick subsequently attended our April and May meetings, and was very enthused about restoring his car, and had already started on the bodywork. Mrs. Pirkl did tell me that she wants to continue the work that Dick had started, and to completely restore the car, and I hope we can help her to accomplish that.

Vashon Tour Retrospective

Our annual Vashon Island Tour, held this year on June 22nd, was I think an unqualified success. We had hoped for a good turnout, and I was a little disappointed when we were ready to leave the meeting point in West Seattle to head for the ferry dock and we only had eight Lotus in caravan, but at the wheel of my own running Lotus for the first time at an Evergreen Lotus event I was set for a fun day. After we were loaded on the ferry, a quick look around shows that we've gained several more cars that met us at the ferry. As we stream off the boat on the Vashon side, we're immediately joined at the first side road by a couple more, and after motoring for a while, when we stop at a rest area we pick up yet another car. The final count was I believe 14 Lotus-types, along with several other members in other cars along for the day's driving enjoyment. And I'm sure all who went on the Tour will agree that the roads of Vashon Island are made to be driven and enjoyed. After some spirited driving, the day was capped off by a trip down to the Larsons', for more to eat and drink, and a walk on the beach, and some enjoyable conversation in good company. Our thanks to Dave and Alice, and we're already looking forward to next year; Dave has mentioned that, as most of us got stuck waiting several hours for ferries back home after the day's festivities, next year's Tour will probably be held on a Saturday to avoid that.

LOTUS Day/EXPO 86 and the Pacific Rim Lotus Meet

After an enjoyable evening get-together at Bruce Patrick's home on Wed. in West Vancouver, Thursday morning, Lotus Day, dawned, well, damp, ans as we made our way to the staging area to enter the EXPO site the rain increased. By the time we were in and set up a downpour had started which continued throughout the morning. In spite of this, the Lotus display was well run by Kim Spencer and a final count of 52 Loti were on display. Once the rain had let up in the afternoon, the crowds of people looking at and admiring our cars continued to grow throughout the day, and there were certainly some fine cars worthy of the compliments they were receiving.

The track day at Westwood track on Friday was perhaps not quite as well run, in that the tech requirements weren't avaiable ahead of time and some of our members (some of the BC members as well, for that matter) weren't prepared for some of the requirements and so decided not to participate. I had a lot of fun myself, even more so in the afternoon when a light rain made the track a little slippery— if you want to drive fast and slide around tight turns a racetrack is the only place to do it; I had the added bonus of a sticking throttle/carb linkage which came me an occasional extra couple thousand RPM at some inopportune times— lots of fun.

The Sat. morning rally, as a new experience for most of our members, I think was also fun (after we found the starting point that is—a portent of things to come?). The rally's conclusion left us near the Westwood gate, and after a little hassle at the gate we got in to watch some interesting Vintage racing including quite a few Lotuses on the track. We hit the track ourselves for the club parade laps during the lunch break.

I think the Pacific Rim Meet was well done, and LCCBC President Hugh McLellan deserves a lot of thanks for all his efforts in making it a success. Granted there were some minor problems here and there, which led to a lot of complaining (myself included), but taken in light of all the work that went into the entire event, they were just minor things. We only hope that if and when we put on a large event like that we do as well.
