To get right to business, we've got several events upcoming in the next couple of weeks- some of these have already been mentioned in the last few newsletters, but I'd like to cover the latest info, and our club's planned participation.

- 1) Next event is the Morgan Club-hosted picnic at Fort Casey on Whidbey Island, occurring on Saturday, May 2nd. This looks like it will be a well-attended event as several other British car clubs besides our own are taking advantage of the MOGs' kind invitation and will be participating. Should you wish to drive along with the Morgans, remember that they'll be departing from the Westwater Inn in Olympia, at 7:30am on Saturday- full details in the last flyer. Alternately, we are planning a scenic drive of our own, so as to arrive at Fort Casey at about noon, and hope that all of you not heading up from Olympia will join us. We will be meeting here at my house, from say 9:00 on, and will depart at 10:00, and then drive up Highway 9, past Arlington and toward Sedro Woolley (some excellent Lotus roads), and then over to Whidbey Island via Deception Pass. If time permits we can make a brief drive through LaConner, or we can go back this way after the picnic. We would like to see as many of our members out for this as possible, either with (preferably) or without your Lotus, so pack up a picnic basket and join us for what promises to be a full day. P.S. bring a flashlight, too, for exploring the catacombs of the old fort, and some warm clothes, as Fort Casey can be a little cool and windy; but then, our Seven drivers will come well-prepared!
- 2) Next up is the Second Annual All British Meet in Vancouver BC- entry form appeared in the last flyer for this as well, and I hope a few of you are planning to head up for this. Jim Kirbach was the sole Evergreen Lotus representative at this meet last year, but he reported that there were some beautiful cars on display and it's well worth attending. We are planning to go up early Saturday morning, and anyone who would like to drive along with us is more than welcome- please note that cars must be in place in the park by 11:00am, so we're planning to leave here about 8:00, as it's about a two-hour drive from here. This is on Saturday, May 9th- there also will be a slalom, for those so inclined on Sunday the 10th.
- 3) The following Saturday, the 16th is the day we had planned for our regular monthly meeting, as we've been keeping pretty regularly to meeting on the third Sat. of the month. As the XK Jaguar Restoration Club is holding their annual British Auto Swap Meet on that day, we are going to use their event as our meeting site, so please make note of the info we've reprinted in this issue concerning this event, held at the Hidden Valley Office Park, in Bellevue at 1750 112th NE, just west of I-405. If you have any British car parts to dispose of, Lotus or otherwise, bring them along. We will as usual have our short business meeting at noon (i.e. 1:00), and as our newest Lotus dealer, George Platis is only a few blocks away, we may take a little drive over to say hello and look at their trio of Turbos.
- 4) The following Saturday, the 23rd, the Vintage Racing Club of BC, which puts on the Vintage Weekend at Westwood each year, will be having their vintage driving training (this was originally scheduled for May 9th, but was changed so as not to conflict with the All British Meet that day).
- 5) On Saturday, June 13th, the LCCBC will be putting on another swap meet, at MCL Motor Cars in Vancouver- this will run from 10am to 4pm, and will be followed by a BBQ at Bruce Patrick's new home- more details on this to follow.

So, as you can see Lotussing season is upon us—while you'd be a real diehard to attend all these events, we hope you'll at least find the time to take in a few over the course of the spring and summer months, and get to know some of your fellow Evergreen Lotus members. 



The above ad, reprinted from the March '87 issue of Classic and Sportscar, shows that Team Lotus are disposing of much of their racing heritage of the last ten years, with no doubt a fair amount of prompting from the new sponsor, Camel- it wouldn't do to have all these old cars sitting around emblazoned with the livery of "that other cigarette company", even though "that other company" had sponsored Team Lotus for nearly eighteen years, through both the seasons of glory and triumph that are common knowledge to any Fl fan, and also through the lean years, including and especially their renewal of faith and confidence in the Team after the death of Colin Chapman in December 1982. I for one will miss the distinctive JPS Black and Gold, and only hope that in the disposal sale ongoing of the JPS-marked cars, that Hazel Chapman is at least keeping one of each type for her personal collection in the "Piggery"-Colin was never much for keeping relics of the past, something he regretted later when he wanted to add a Lotus 25 to his collection and couldn't find one anywhere, for any price.

Having just attended the second such Lotus meet, co-sponsored by the Golden Gate Lotus Club and Lotus/West, I'd like to share some of my impressions of the weekend.

The central California coast is a beautiful area, and the weather could not have been better, sunny and about 70 degrees, a fair cry from last year's meet which was rained on almost all weekend from the reports. You might think that with a major meet and favorable skies, there would be more Lotuses present than you could look at in a weekend. Well, I must say that I was disappointed in the turnout, as there were only some 36 or so cars there (i.e. less than half the number we were able to turn out when we were the honored marque at Portland in '85!)— considering the size of the two sponsoring groups, GGLC with about 250 members, and L/W is certainly a large group as well, I was actually hoping they might have as many as 100 cars.

First event was a wine tour, and I rode with a L/W member in his Europa TC, and although I'm not a wine drinker (the only time I ever drink the stuff is on wine tours!) this was fun- first stop was the Arciero winery, a name that some of you may recognize; the Arcieros sponsored a racing team in the '60s, and Dan Gurney drove a Lotus 19 for them (a car which they recently restored at an exorbitant cost and now vintage-race), and they are still involved in racing, in CART, Super Vee, and off-road, and had examples of these three racing classes on display in their winery.

The banquet Saturday night featured two guest speakers, Steve Barber of Barber Bros. Lotus in Concord CA, and Max Griggs, the #2 man in Lotus Cars here in the US. Steve Barber spoke with great conviction on the future of Lotus in the US, and in particular on the great strides they've made in quality control, which should see the Lotus fortunes in the US market recover in much the same way that Jaguar has reversed their long-standing reputation for unreliabilty. As I told him later, I wish we had a dealer in this area with the enthusiastic committment to the marque that he has. Max Griggs spoke of the projected release dates of the new Elan and the Etna (and kept mixing the two up) and showed some tapes of the active suspension Excel test car- his most interesting statement, to me, was the fact that Lotus, in their continued support of the older cars, is now in the process of lowering their prices on parts for Elans, Europas, etc by on average 30-60%- this is going on now and should be completed in about a months time. This is certainly welcome news if it proves to be correct, however in my discussions with Bill Bennetts of George Platis, our new Lotus dealer, he stated that they were not planning to carry any parts for the earlier cars in the forseeable future, so it will still be a matter of ordering parts elsewhere.

I did meet some of the people running the groups down there- Dan Griffin, the pres. of Lotus/West, and Larry Lim, their newsletter editor, and also saw Kiyoshi Hamai, the editor of the GGLC's Chapman Report, whom I'd met once before, and we are going to be exchanging newsletters with both these groups now.

All in all, while it was certainly an enjoyable weekend, and I'm glad I went down for the meet (although with some problems on the trip back I didn't get home until 4:15am Monday morning, and had to leave for work at 7), I still was disappointed that there weren't more people and cars in attendace.









Also, we're one behind as there wasn't an issue for Nov/Dec of last year (did anyone even notice?).

First item- Lezlee and I were planning an informal little get-together here this coming weekend, which we had mentioned at the last meeting, sort of a bon voyage party for Maury and John Montag before they head south, but due to schedule conflicts we'll have to cancel that perhaps we'll have something when they get back.

Additions to the calendar that appeared in the last issue of LOTUS LINES:

Saturday, April 11- The MG Car Club has invited us to participate with them in a drive up to Skagit County and LaConner- details on time and meeting place to follow.

Saturday, April 18- The Northwest Alfa Romeo Club is having a Drivers Training Clinic at SIR, which I can now report will be open to other cars such as ours. The entry from is reprinted elsewhere in this issueplease note a couple of things- 1)if you pre-register by April 6th the cost is \$30.00, otherwise it's \$45.00 (and assuming there are any spaces left- a limit of 50 cars, notice, which they easily filled last year); 2) they are requiring that non-Alfa participants use their marque cars, an entirely reasonable idea as they want to get some interesting cars out, so don't enter as an Evergreen Lotus member but plan to drive your brand X everyday car- Lotus only, please. So, if you're interested in participating, send in your registration as soon as possible, and then check over your car to make sure it'll pass tech (for your own benefit). As this is the day that we had slated for the monthly club meeting, we are now planning to have our meeting down at SIR, during the lunch break of the Drivers Training. I should mention that you are of course welcome to come down and observe the cars taking part in the Track Day without entering yourself, and there's no charge to get in, so we would like to see as many from our group as possible come down and "show the flag" which is one reason why we would like to have the meeting there at the track.

Saturday, May 9- The VRC (Vintage Racing Club of BC, which puts on the Vintage Weekend at Westwood each year- see the last issue for info and entry form) is having their drivers school at Westwood on May 9th (preceded by a mandatory class session the evening before)- cost is \$60.00 Canadian, which includes a membership in the VRC, which is \$30.00 Cdn alone. This event unfortunately is the same day as the All British Meet in Vancouver (for more info on this, see below) but if you are interested in participating in the Vintage Weekend and don't currently have a vintage or competition license this Drivers School would be a must. Contact me for info on how to sign up. Incidentally- the cut-off date for vintage-eligible Elans, Europas and Sevens is 31 December 1969; the LCCBC had petitioned the VRC to allow some later cars, but was just turned down.

Also on May 9th is the All-British Car Meet in Vancouver, and we now have entry forms for this meet, which are reprinted in this issue. If you're interested in entering this Meet, please do send your entry in as soon as possible, for a couple of reasons- first, to ensure that you will get one of the 20 spaces (two classes, 10 cars per class) now allotted for Lotus; second, the meet directors have informed me that if response is great enough, they'll add a third class of 10 cars for Lotus which would likely then be assigned to the Third Generation cars (Elite, Eclat, Esprit).

May Meeting- we still don't have a meeting site arranged for our May meeting, tentitively scheduled now for the 16th- any volunteers?

June Meeting- John and Nikki Daniels will be hosting this one, which will include their rally they had planned for last year which we never got around to- more details, map etc to follow in an upcoming newsletter.

Hear of an event you think might be of interest to Evergreen Lotus members? Let us know about it. Think you might like to put on something (backroads tour, brewery or winery tour, etc etc)- we would welcome some members taking the initiative and planning some little event once in a while. For example, do you want to have a garage tour this year? - if so, how about volunterring to organize it, by making a few phone calls and lining up some garages to visit, then setting up a meeting place and route for the participants to follow. It's easy enough to do, but I sure could use some help on little projects like this. Thanks.
