

A TRUE LOTUS FIELD TRIP

The other day. I heard a rumer that there was a pack of Lotus parked in a field between Carnation and Redmond. Armed with instructions and a spare newsletter. Nikki and I set out. Low and behold, we found the field and they really were Lotuses. We went down a lane and found a shop full of people working. Not being able to see what they were doing. I made sure Nikki was in front when we got out of the car. As soon as I mentioned Lotus, we were greeted by Jeff Johnson and Adrian. Jeff is a distributor for Spyder frames and a Super Seven like kit car (ed. Silverstone). He also builds Europa bodies and assembles replicas. One example was almost finished with a DeLorean V6 and transaxle installed (good looking package). Jeff gave us a quick tour that included the following cars:

Twincam Europa - Early Elite (race prepared) - Europa replica Elan Coupe - Turbo Esprit - one off custom design coupe

I guess several of the above may be for sale. but when I offered advertising. Jeff asked me not to do it as he is too busy. If you want more information, let me know.

The opening 1989 Vintage race event in the Pacific Northwest occurred March 25th, sponsored by SOVREN (the Society of Vintage Racing Enthusiasts)— it was a hillclimb at SIR, consisting of timed runs starting from the back straight, clockwise through turns 3B, then 3A, through turn 1 and on to the usual start/finish line. 20 to 25 cars competed, many of them open roadsters which was impressive as it rained steadily all day. We personally decided not to drive our F3 car (ed. note— John's Effyh), and opted for the Lotus Europa, with wipers, and heater blasting— much more civilized. Some most interesting cars participated— an Allard J2X with LeMans body, which was trying to put 500hp to the wet ground through skinny tires; a quite rapid Porsche 914/6 GT, and several Lotus 7s.

A lunch was served at the noon break- chili, homemade bread and a salad, prepared by this year's SOVREN president Donna Thorson, and served under a large tent- it don't get much better than that!

FTD was posted by Hugh Archer of the VRC (the Vintage Racing Club of BC) in a Porsche 356 (a Porsche- come on you Lotus drivers!).

THE ANNUAL HUNHOLZ HAPPENING Sunday, 28 May 2:00pm

An addition to our calendar since the listing in the last newsletter is this very worthwhile event, hosted by John and Betty Hunholz at their home in the Lake Forest Park area (19529 45th NE, phone 364-8783). This is an annual, pre-race season get-together for the Seattle area race fraternity, and some very nice cars are usually on display, along with the opportunity to see John's collection, as an "unjudged car show" in John's words. All makes are welcome, Evergreen Lotus members are cordially invited to bring your Lotus out, let's see if we can have a good turnout of Club cars.

To add to the articles by John Hunholz in this issue concerning local vintage racing, and SOVREN (the Society of Vintage Racing Enthusiasts)—we have been invited to participate as a group at the Vintage Race days on Saturday and Sunday, June 24th and 25th, and those participating in their Lotus will receive two free entries to the races. The group having the largest turnout will also be allowed to participate in the parade laps during the lunch break (sound like a challenge?). There also will be a Club Play-Day at SIR on Wednesday, May 17th—I believe this is in conjunction with the Alfa club.

For those who might be inclined to vintage-race their Lotus, I have copies of the eligibility requirements for SOVREN, but in general Lotus would fall in one of two classes:

Vintage: Lotuses built before 31 December 1961(or later cars built to the same design and specs (for example a 1962 Elite)

Historic: cars from 12/31/61 to 12/31/69 so, Elans through S4, but not Sprints; Europa (Renault) not Twin Cam

Membership is \$30.00/year, plus a one-time \$10.00 initiation fee. Contact Terry Elmore or John Hunholz for further details. Incidentally, the current President of SOVREN, Donna Thorson, is a Lotus Seven driver.





LOTUS TIPS from Mark Gucker

WHEELS

I had my set of steel wheels trued by an old wire wheel shop. Call Ben Foster at Foster Wheel, 789-5353. Ben can easily get wheel run-out below LOTUS specifications. Upon request, he will check tolerance with a dial indicator. I suggest you ask. Ben does very good work.

EXHAUST

It is possible to use VOLKSWAGEN exhaust gaskets to replace the all asbestos stock gasket. The VW gasket is made of a sandwich of asbestos between two sheets of aluminum. I have had no leaks so far, and these gaskets will not stick to the aluminum head. The VW part number is: 1112512618.

CLUTCH

The clutch slave cylinder is held in place on the clutch assembly with a circlip, LOTUS part number 02606006. The circlip is illustrated in the Bean Catalog on page JS9. Substituting an external snap ring makes removal and installation much simpler.

INTERRIOR TRIM

On the Elan S1 and S2, it is possible to replace the rear interrior trim willnuts and 4BD screws with locally available parts. Wellnuts are available at many boat and marine suppliers (Doc Freeman's in Seattle) and stainless screws from most industrial hardware stores.

BRAKES

Do not wire brush or sand blast the brake caliper assemblies. These units have protective plating that may be damaged with mechanical cleaning methods. Clean parts with denatured alcohol and a brush. Apply a coat of epoxy paint for additional protection.

If your Elan still has the chrome plated steel caliper pistons, they are likely seized. R&D Enterprises has stainless steel replacements that will not give you any future problems, and your brakes will work TOO!

Check if your brake pads are correct. Did you know power assist systems use a different pad than the leg-strong systems?

Warning! It is recommended you don't separate the caliper assembly.

Come out and watch or drive. It's a lot of fun. Location is the Boeing Kent Space Center. Take the Orilla Rd. exit from I-5 and go east into the valley. The Boeing facility will be on your left. Call the Autocross Hotline for more information (524-5020). Everyone is welcome.
