If you haven't received your prize yet, come to the next meeting, I have several of them.



1990 CALENDAR by Terry Elmore

I recently attended, as a representative of the Evergreen Lotus Car Club, a meeting set up by Kevin Cobley and Rob Broderick of the MG Car Club. This gathering, attended also by representatives from a number of other local British car clubs, was called to compile a master calendar of 1990 club events. This will serve several functions:

- 1) Each club will have a readily-accessible fisting of events being put on by the other clubs, including regular meetings, special events, tech sessions, tours, etc.
- 2) Each club will now know which events are open, for participation by others besides the sponsoring club- with dates, times and contact phone numbers.
- 3) For clubs such as ours, who don't have an entire year's events planned, such a calendar can help us avoid scheduling future events in conflict with other major events that club members may wish to attend. It also supplies us with an abundance of ideas that we can "borrow" for ourselves, either directly or with modification to suit our own group's needs.

A listing of our meeting locations for the next several months, along with the annual Evergreen Lotus picnic, which Lezlee and I will be hosting in August, along with information on the Camel Lotus Meet in Arizona in March, and the West Coast Lotus Meet in California in June, was provided for the Lotus entries on the Calendar. As soon as we receive the compiled listing, upcoming events of interest, especially those open events which we are allowed to participate in, will be passed along to the membership both through the newsletter and at the monthly meetings; major events, such as the out-of-state Lotus events will be covered with early information as soon as available, to enable you to make plans should you wish to attend. For example, we draw your attention to the two above-mentioned Lotus events, which have been discussed at the last two meetings and are covered in this issue- in particular, should you be interested in attending the Camel Lotus event in March, please note that your entry must be received in England by February 22nd. Entry forms for the West Coast Lotus Meet will be provided just as soon as they are available; there are already a number of Evergreen Lotus members planning to attend this event.

WESTERN WASHINGTON ALL BRITISH MEET

After the meeting on the Master Calendar, reported above, I spoke with Rob Broderick on plans for this year's All British Meet, to be held again at Bellevue Community College.

This year will see a one-day event, to be held on Saturday, July 21st, the primary reason being that that is also the opening weekend for the Goodwill Games, and it was not possible to find a hotel willing to hold a block of room for the Meet participants; there also will not be a banquet for this year, for the same reason, and all awards will be given on the field at the conclusion of judging.

This year will see something different, in that we, along with the other participating clubs, will have both a financial committment, and a prospect of a substantial financial return on that investment, in the Meet itself. The organizers will be selling shares in the Meet, to raise the operating costs needed; based on an estimate of the monies needed (there was a surplus from last year's meet, which has provided the initial funds to get things rolling) and the number of marque clubs participating, each club will probably be offered a chance to buy a "share" at a cost of around \$100; then, again based on last year's experience, the clubs will receive anywhere from \$300 to \$500 as return on their investment. Obviously, there are still details to be worked out, and none of this is official yet, but it looks like an excellent opportunity for a small club like ours, that doesn't have as many of the fund-raising opportunities that the larger groups do, to make a substantial increase in our treasury. More details as they are available.

As a result of our initial display last year, we have a number of ideas for our "new & improved. Mk. 2 display this year, which won't be divulged here (as other clubs see our newsletter, and we don't want them stealing our ideas while we steal theirs!), but these will be proffered at the next few meetings as we put together a committee to work on this year's display.


CAMEL LOTUS OWNERS' PARTY

SCOTTSDALE/PHOENIX, ARIZONA MARCH 8, 1990

Included in this issue in an entry form for members interested in attending this event, to take place the Thursday before the US Grand Prix in Phoenix on March 11, the first race of the 1990 Formula I season. Hosted by Team Lotus sponsors, R J Reynolds, there will be a concours, and a dinner which will include as guests or honor the two new drivers for Camel Team Lotus, Derek Warwick and Martin Donnelly.

Initial information on this event included the stipulation that, to receive two entry tickets to the dinner, one would have to drive their Lotus to the event (with the exception on racing Lotus, which could be trailered). Most recent information received, via Mark Winston of Lotus Ltd. (thanks, Mark), is that this requirement has now been waived. You still must send your entry in before February 22nd, and Team Lotus will be verifying with the club that you are in fact a member in good standing of a Lotus club (so, pay your dues if you haven't done so yet for this year!)

R J Reynolds is expecting some 400-500 people at their party, how many of these will be driving Lotus is anybody's guess, but I suspect that even with the relatively short notice, there will be a fairly good turnout for the concours. They obviously are using their concours categories from their UK events- there are twelve classes, including one each for Lotus Sunbeams and Excels, which are liable to be rather sparsely populated (although GM did bring two Excels over, at least one of which had a Quad 4 dropped in it, but I believe one has already been shipped back).

WEST COAST LOTUS MEET 1990

This Meet has been mentioned at the past several club meetings, but we have delayed publishing the details in the Lotus Lines until now at the request of the Meet organizers while they were still trying to get the requisite site committments. This is now done, so we can report to you that the West Coast Lotus Meet will take place on June 1,2, and 3 (Friday-Sunday), based at Sears Point Raceway which is located near Sonoma, California. While details on a number of the possible events at the WCLM are yet to be confirmed, and entry forms and Meet costs are not yet available, we want to provide you with as much information as we now have, so that if you're thinking of attending you can begin to make plans. Several Evergreen Lotus members have attended previous WCLMs (I have been to two, myself), and this year's Meet, particularly with the tie-in to the vintage races, promises to be the best one yet. I would like to highlight a few of the possible attractions at this event:

*The hoped-for turnout of <u>Lotus Formula I cars</u> would be a real feast for the eyes and ears, showing some of the most significant models Chapman produced in his quest for seven Constructors titles (25,49,72,78 are all possible attendees); I look on this as a preview of what's in store when Lotus is finally the honored marque at the Monterey Historics, and we see the greatest-ever gathering of race and street Lotus in the US, an event not to be missed and one which I hope we'll see within the next three years.


*The prospect of a half-, or full <u>day on the track</u> at Sears Point on Friday- as those who participated in Bayside's Track Day at SIR this year can attest, it's a lot of fun to turn hot laps in a Lotus, driving your car as it should be driven and under the proper conditions.

*As Mike Ostrov, Secretary of Club Elite USA is involved in organizing the Meet as a GGLC member and vintage racer, I suspect we will see the <u>largest gathering of early Elites</u> in the US as an integral part of the Meet (again, a preview of Lotus at Monterey). Of the approximately 1000 Elites produced, at least 92 now reside in California, or nearly 10% of the original production- an amazingly high percentage, and while certainly not all of them are running or restored, the prospect of several dozen Elites gathered in one place is a sight not to be missed.

*The <u>Silverado Concours</u>, which will take place on Sunday June 3rd, is the second-largest *Concours* on the West Coast; as 1990 is I believe the 25th anniversary of this event, they will no doubt put on an even greater show to commemmorate the occasion.

*Add to this all the other attractions of the Bay Area, if you are able to spend any time either before or after the WCLM itself to see something besides cars, cars, cars.....


