## Participant Rules:


- 1) Alcohol and drugs are strictly prohibited.
- 2) Helmets (1975 or later Snell rating) are required for driver and passengers. Eye protection is required for drivers and passengers of open cars (glasses will suffice).
- 3) Open cars must have a roll bar. If you are fitting a roll bar for NWARC events, contact Marilyn Williams, NWARC Competition Chairman, at (206) 935-3979 for specifications.
- 4) Factory installed three-point seatbelts or five-point racing harnesses are required.
- 5) All drivers are required to attend a driver's meeting at the track.
- 6) All drivers are required to work turns at some time during the event.
- 7) This will be a QUIET day all cars MUST be equipped with street legal mufflers in order to run!
- 8) Invited marque club members must drive their invited marque cars.
- 9) All drivers who have not driven at a NWARC track event before will be required to have a designated club member ride in their car before being allowed on the track alone.

Additionally, a secured fire extinguisher is recommended. Bring a full tank of gas, increase you tire pressure to 36 psi (air is easier to let out than to add at the track), change your oil and filter and bring extra oil and coolant. Take time to inspect your car before you come to the track.
