





LOTUS 50 YEAR ANIVERSARY

BRANDS HATCH - JUNE 6/7

1990 will mark the 50 Year Anniversary of Lotus and to celebrate the occasion THE FORCE run by David and Lorina McLaughlin are coordinating a two day event at Brands Hatch over the weekend of June 6/7.

'...we are aware of course that there will be other meetings in 1990 but above all else Lotus drivers are racers and there was clearly a need for an event where owners of all types of Lotus could get together at a circuit to celebrate this anniversary. Discussions with Lotus owners and clubs produced great enthusiasm and John Nicol at Brands Hatch has been most supportive, so our aim now is to make this the. Lotus event of the year.'

The weekend will include a Track Day on Saturday when Lotus owners of all types will be able to drive their road, sprint. or race cars on the circuit. Sunday will features races exclusively for Lotus with outings for Sports Racing cars Elans, Elites, Cortinas, 7's and of course single seaters of all classes from Formula Junior up to Grand Prix cars.

During the course of the weekend there will be demonstrations of many important Lotus cars including their World Championship winners as well as club meetings, concourse automobile sales, dealer demonstrations, and many other events.

High spot of the weekend for many will be the Jim Clark Commemorative Dinner to be held on Saturday evening. 1990 also marks the 30th anniversary of the death at Hockenheim of this great Lotus driver and to celebrate his career, drivers, owners, mechanics and other 'Lottiseers' will attend a dinner at Brands, the scene of so many great wins for the Scottish double World Champion.

David said 'we already have incredible interest not only from the UK but we expect Lotus enthusiasts from Canada, USA and Australia as well as Europe to attend. We truly believe that June 6/7 will mark the greatest assembly of Lotus there has ever been'.
