But May is a very busy month so you can drive to Long Beach as well as learn about the paint process as part of automobile restoration.


But since ELCC has been a little quiet, and since I've become acutely aware of how the few make these organizations go, I'm going to talk

So what does the WCCC do?

"Our sole purpose is to promote and protect the automotive hobby. We strive to keep clubs, interested groups and individuals informed of proposed actions that may have an effect on the automotive hobby. We also work to promote enactment of legislative, executive, or administrative actions that further the interest of our mernbers and the automotive hobby."

The Washington Car Club Council has worked for legislation allowing fenderless street rods, blue dot tail lights, preventing restrictions on the purchase of automotive paint, and a bill that called for the scrappage of old cars to provide pollution credit for industries that pollute the air.

My personal favorite, as I currently own cars in the 1969 to 1975 era is the relaxation of emissions testing. Vehicles more than 25 years old will be exempted from the state's emissions test requirement beginning Jan. 1, 2000 and 30year old collector cars will be exempted this year.

I'll have more to report in the future as I'm getting a real education on the political process, but the current challenges seem to fall into three areas, emissions testing, your right to keep your cars on your property, and registration requirements. So think about what is involved in the automotive hobby. Have you modified an engine, owned an unrestored car, needed used parts, painted a car yourself, or tried to get an older or modified car through the emissions test? The WCCC has been working for your interests.

So the WCCC has been working for you, now you're thinking.....what can I do for the WCCC? There are two bills that need your support.

1. House Bill 1174 will limit the ability of cities, counties and municipalities to enact zoning regulations that will keep hobbyists from storing parts cars and other vehicles on their private property, providing the vehicle is property stored.

2. House Bill 1175 will allow kit and assembled vehicles to be licensed as "Street Rods" and enjoy the benefits of operating without fenders, hoods or windshields. Kit cars would also be exempt from emissions testing.

And supporting the Washington Car Club Council

is easy. Call the legislature hotline at 1-800-562-6000 and they will take your message of support for HB1174 and HB1175

The WCCC meetings have been held on the first Tuesday of the month in Overlake. In an effort to make the meetings easier to attend for the clubs outside of metropolitan Seattle, the meetings will now be on Saturday at 9 in the morning and will rotate from Seattle to a south location to a north location. This is intended to encourage participation and should create interesting little car shows as people bring their toys to the meetings.

What has been revealing to me is how this process works. Scott Cedergreen seems to be the prime mover in this organization and his knowledge is extensive. He knows which elected officials are "Car People" and he stays in contact with them to help promote bills that are friendly to our hobby and defend against the bills that take away from our hobby. As an example, there was a bill that would have eliminated the exemption for emissions testing for cars older than 30 years that was in committee. Having relationships with the committee members is part of the process of derailing unfriendly legislation.

One of the current initiatives of the WCCC is to determine the legislative districts that the various car clubs and their membership reside. By tying club membership with their representatives, the WCCC will have an even greater influence on the legislation that affects our hobby. Another technique to make the political process operate so that you can continue to enjoy your vehicle.



1999 West Coast Lotus Meet Track Day

Sunday, May 16th - Thunderhill Raceway -- The Lotus Track Day will be held on the 3.0 mile, 15 turn Thunderhill Raceway. This track will challenge drivers and cars to the ultimate test.

Drivers will be divided into groups reflecting driving experience and car preparation. The NOVICE GROUP will be for drivers with little or no track experience. The INTERMEDIATE GROUP is for drivers with some to considerable experience. The ADVANCED GROUP is for drivers with competition licenses and race prepared cars. The Novice and Intermediate Groups will be broken into smaller groups and assisted by Advanced drivers familiar with the finer points of high speed driving.

Please be aware that high speeds can be attained and there is risk and danger. The number one goal is safety. **THIS IS NOT A RACE!** Passing is restricted to safety zones for Novice and Intermediate Groups. The course will be manned by professional corner workers. Any behavior seen as unsafe will be grounds for dismissal. We cannot over emphasize the need for level heads and safety first attitudes from all involved. All cars must be tech and safety inspected prior to going on track.
