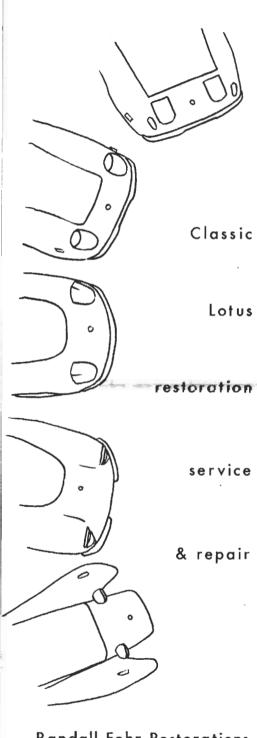
You may think I am pulling your leg a little, but Park Place Ltd

indeed took delivery of two Lotus 340R's in mid April, It started last fall when Lotus Cars USA decided to import eight 340R's to sell for track and show purposes. From the Chair

Our events now begin to be held outdoors, we hope desperately for good weather, and for those whose project cars aren't finished, we wish we had been more diligent during the winter. This is my letter of encouragement to everyone (including myself, I hope). There are a lot of things happening, so I am encouraging all ELCC members to take advantage of the many offerings from our club and other groups. Looking ahead, we have rallies planned for both June and August, as well as our traditional menu of Vintage Races at SIR and the ABFM, both scheduled in July. The combination of a string of successful events so far this year, along with a summer that is going to be busy, has led us to give everyone a break during May as a way to focus on car preparation for the upcoming outings. While there won't be an official ELCC event for May, there are, however, 2 excellent options you might want to check out.

First is the SOVREN Spring Sprints. Essentially a mini version of their July event, they typically attract over 100 vintage cars who run a full 2 day schedule of races during the weekend. The second event in May is touted elsewhere in this newsletter. The 2nd Annual Run to the Gorge is a self-paced and beautiful drive that ends in Hood River, Oregon. It can be run in one day; with the option of staying overnight and joining others at the evening banquet. So, for anyone who doesn't think they will get their fill of driving from the two club rallies, I encourage you to try out this one as well.

As for the events in July, it is important to the ELCC to be well represented at both the Car Corral at SIR, and the ABFM. I'll begin my pleading early by asking that everyone with a running Lotus plan on attending those events. This year, the club will have a canopy and club banner set up at each event, and it would look pretty silly to just have one car parked under it. I know, I know, this is a "do as I say, not as I do" statement, coming from me. But I hope you will all indulge me anyway, and I look forward to these events as some of the highlights of the year.

I would also like everyone to begin thinking about next year's calendar. While we will be having a specific event in September geared toward a photo shoot, there are plenty of great pictures to be had all summer long. So, when you come to an event, bring along a camera and keep your eyes and shutters looking for good pictures. In fact, one of the best pictures around right now is that incredible 340R at Park Place Motors. If you haven't seen it yet, I suggest you drop by for a visit. By today's standards,

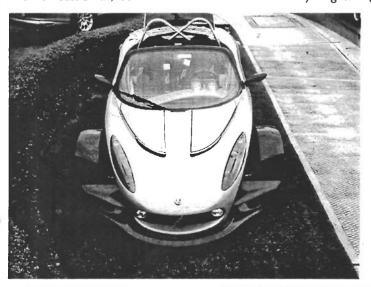

have an extra \$80K, a long driveway with lots of twisties and your fortune hasn't been wiped out by the sagging stock market, this might be the car for you. Even if you can't afford it, you really should take a trip down to Park Place and take a look. The 340R is really a wild ride.

For those of you who haven't seen it, the 340R is a limited production track car with only 340 total units being produced. It shares the same bonded, extruded aluminum chassis as the Elise. On top is minimal fiberglass and carbon fiber



bodywork covering the cabin. A clear, see-through plastic panel is all there is to protect you from a side impact. Power is provided by a 177hp version of the same Rover engine found in the Elise Sport. If you want to work on the engine, you had better break out the allen wrench set to remove the 8 bolts that hold the engine cover down. From a functional standpoint, the 340R is basically a striped down Elise with all the unnecessary amenities like ventilation, radio, windows, doors, roof, etc, removed. Not really your best Seattle car, but this is for weekend track days right?



The dashboard consists of 2 stack gauges, a couple buttons for operating the headlights, and a start button. No power options on this puppy, but if just so happen to own two heated jump suits for winter driving, you will be thrilled to know two cigarette lighter power sockets are located between the seats against the rear bulkhead for your convenience. Sitting in the 340R is much more comfortable than the standard Elise or the Elise Sport. The molded bucket seats have the right amount of cushioning and a very nice four point racing harness keeps you snuggly in place during the sharpest of corners. The seat is adjustable and there is plenty of legroom too! Thanks to the lack ofeverything, Lotus was able to shave more fat off the already light Elise and bring the 340R curb weight down to 1320 pounds. This helps give the car a 300hp/ton power to weight ratio and a 0-60mph start of 4.3 sec. Top speed is limited to around 130mph.

The difference in driving the 340R and an Esprit is like

comparing the Esprit to a Honda. There really is no comparison and it is such a unique driving experience that no car in production today can replicate it. The 340R is a modern day version of Chapman's Seven. Barebones, simple, extremely light weight and packs incredible performance. Not to mention the car is a real head turner.

In my younger days, I had a couple go-karts. My favorite stunt was to do a 360 spin in the road and keep on going. Going about 25-30 mph, I would crank the steering all the way to one side while tapping on the brakes. That would send me into a quick 180. If you went opposite lock at the end of the 180, the spinning momentum would bring you around the next 180. As you come about 360, you get on the gas, straighten the wheels back out and you are off heading down the road again. I haven't seen it for myself, but David Bruski of Park Place tells me he downloaded a short video clip off the Internet of a 340R doing just that, a 360 spin while driving straight down the road. Looking at the car, I can believe it. Maybe he will let me try it some day...

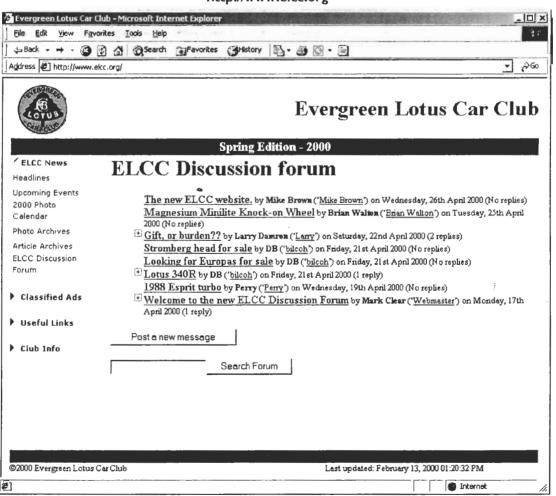
